

Year 2 - Flat Stanley



What do I need to do?

To make my Flat Stanley...

- 1) Draw your own Flat Stanley (not smaller than A4 size).
- 2) Colour him in and laminate him if you can.
- 3) Send him to a friend or relative by post.
- 4) Ask the relative or friend to take a picture of Flat Stanley at his new location.
- 5) Write all about Flat Stanley's new location, including human and physical features.

What I am learning & why?

We would like the children to make a Flat Stanley and send it to a friend or relative who lives in a different locality. This can be overseas or in another town or borough. Document the project by drawing a picture of where your Flat Stanley will be going. Write about the human and physical features of where he is travelling to.

- Crayons, pencil colours and/or markers
- Lined paper for your diary entry

Questions to think about:

- Where can I send Flat Stanley?
- What is exciting about this location?
- What are human and physical features?
- Can Flat Stanley see any human or physical features in his new location?
